Dream Character - 04.14.2013

Dream Defined: an inspiring picture of the future that energizes your mind, will, and emotions, empowering you to do everything you can to achieve it. A dream worth pursuing is a picture and blueprint of a person's purpose and potential."

CHARACTER: Moral quality. The principles and motives that control a persons life. Honest, faithful, pure, generous and gracious.

- 1) God still uses people from <u>dysfunctional</u> families to accomplish great things for His glory and others good. *Genesis 37:1-5*
- 2) God has a <u>dream</u> and a plan to achieve His dream for our lives. *Genesis 37:6-11; Acts 2:17-18*

A dream doesn't have to be big. It just has to be bigger than you are. Dreams are renewable. No matter what your age or condition, there are still untapped possibilities within us and new beauty waiting to be born. It's never too late to dream.

3) God knows how <u>best</u> to communicate His dream for our lives. He knows we need to see it before we can say it and then have the faith to seize it. He often repeats it so we are sure to get it! Genesis 37:7,9; Genesis 12:1-3; Genesis 15:1-6

How do I get God's dream for my life?

- a) <u>Believe</u> He has one for you. *Jeremiah 1:4-5; Jeremiah 29:11; Ephesians 2:10; Ephesians 3:20*
- b) Prayerfully persist in receiving it. Matthew 7:7-11
- c) Let other "Dreamers" inspire you. (Like Joseph)
- d) <u>Test</u> your dream with God's Word and mature believers. 1 Thessalonians 5:19-21

4) God knows the best plan for fulfilling His dream for our lives. Joseph's life radiates how God builds in us the god-ly <u>character</u> and competence we need to fulfill His dream. Without godly character we collapse under the weight of achieving a dream that far exceeds our human capacity! *Genesis* 37:23-24
