## **Coming Home - Feasting with the Father**

Luke 19:10; Proverbs 29:3; Luke 15:20

1. The father's <u>exuberant</u> response to this wayward son's return should forever break off any notions of a stoic God who is impossible to please. Psalm 139:1-3; 2 Chronicles 16:9; Proverbs 19:23; Matthew 9:36; James 4:8; Luke 15:21-22
2. No matter how far we've wandered from God, when we turn to him with a humble heart, God immediately bestows on us the full privileges of sonship. Zechariah 3:1-4; Isaiah 61:10; Revelation 19:7-8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 2 Peter 1:3; Luke 15:23,24
3. We have a party throwing God who celebrates every repentant heart and He wants us to join him by <u>feasting</u> on His goodness. Matthew 22:2; Isaiah 25:6-8; Luke 15:24; Luke 10:20; Philippians 4:4; Nehemiah 8:9-12; Psalm 23:5; Isaiah 55:1-2; Ephesians 1:18; Psalm 85:6
