1. <u>Care</u> about others like the Father has cared for me, and grieve for those who are away from Him. <i>Genesis 6:5-6;</i> John 3:16
2. <u>Forgive</u> others like the Father has forgiven me so they can have a taste of His forgiveness. <i>Matthew 6:14-15</i>
3. <u>Accept</u> others like the Father has accepted me so they can experience His acceptance. <i>Romans 15:5-7</i>
4. Be generous to others as the Father has been generou to me so they can experience His goodness. Psalm 112:4-7 Ephesians 2:4-7

5. <u>Reconcile</u> others as the Father has reconciled me so they can know there is a Heavenly Father who wants them home.
