1. Forgiveness <u>fills</u> us up with the Thanksgiving goodness of Jesus paying the debt we could never repay- the emptiness of our sinful soul and a meaningless life without Christ. Matthew 18:21-25; Matthew 6:12
2. Forgiveness <u>frees</u> us to forgive. Because our debt is paid in full, we are free to forgive the debts of others. Matthew 18:28-35; Matthew 6:14-15; 2 Corinthians 5:17
3. Forgiveness <u>focuses</u> our life on the need for others to
experience the goodness of Christ's forgiveness through us.
 We forgive because God requires it.

• We forgive in order to avoid entrapment by Satan. 2 Corinthians 2:10b-11
