2. Palm branches signified victory, triumph and peace; the people were looking for someone to physically free them from Roman oppression. God sent Jesus the Lamb to free them and the whole world from the oppression of sin and spiritual death. John 1:29; Exodus 12:1-10; 2 Corinthians 5:21 Hebrews 4:15; Isaiah 53:7; Hebrews 9:26b-28	•
3. Palm Sunday was planned as God's perfect timing for the perfect Lamb to ride into His destiny and arrive at th cross where in just a few days, He would <u>lavish</u> his blood upon all who will receive. 1 Peter 1:18-21; Revelation 5:1-14	- e
