1. Because of what Christ has done, acceptance is the <u>position</u> of God towards humanity, and it's His power at work in our hearts. Acceptance is the gospel in action. Romans 15:7; Acts 10:1-8; Acts 10:9-29; Acts 10:30-36; John 3:16-17; Romans 5:1-2; Romans 5:10-11

2. Acceptance is unconditional in that it is <u>available</u> to every person, however it is conditional upon my willingness to repent of sin, receive Christ's provision for my sin, and in humility embrace the life of doing what is right. Acts 2:38-39; John 1:14; John 5:14; John 8:4-11; James 1:21-22a

3. God's power to accept <u>results</u> in hearts changed and lives lived to the praise of God, and His grace given to all who will repent and receive. *Acts 10:44-48; Acts 11:18*
