Unlikely Heroes God's Plan and Purpose

- Unlikely heroes are imperfect
- Unlikely heroes are heroes because of what God does through them
- God chooses unlikely heroes to fulfill His plan and eternal purposes

God's Eternal Purposes are to Save, Redeem and Change

1. God <u>designed</u> and made Adam and Eve in His own image. Ephesians 3:9-11; 1 Corinthians 15:45-49; 1 Corinthians 15:21-23; Romans 5:12-15; Genesis 1:26a; Genesis 2:7

"Being in God's image means that humans share, though imperfectly and finitely, in God's nature, that is, in His communicable attributes (life, personality, truth, wisdom, love, holiness, justice) and so have the capacity for spiritual fellowship with Him. He also gave them the human will to choose God or choose self." – John Walvoord, The Bible Knowledge Commentary.

2. God <u>allowed</u> Adam to name all the animals God created. *Genesis 2:20, 2 Corinthians 5:18-21*
