The English translation for "judge" encompasses 2 primary Grook ideas used in the New Testament:

Greek ideas used in the New Testament:

 $\kappa\rho$ ív ω To Condemn, to pass judgment on, to speak unfavorably about.

 $\dot{\alpha}$ νακρίνω To Discern, to question or examine.

Jesus' teaching in Matthew 7:1-5 summarized with two phrases...

• Bad judging prohibited

Good judgement practiced

Matthew 7:5-6; Matthew 7:15-16; Matthew 18:15; Galatians 6:1; Matthew 23:25-28

What type of judging is prohibited? <u>Self-righteous</u> (hyper critical) judging! *Matthew 7:3-5; Luke 6:37; Romans 2:1*

Good judgement practiced

Matthew 7:5 – "Hypocrite! First get rid of the log in your own eye; then you will see well enough to deal with the speck in your friend's eye."

1 Corinthians 2:15–16; 1 Corinthians 14:20; Luke 23:14; Acts 17:11; Ephesians 4:15-16; Hebrews 3:13-15

Jesus frees us from the <u>burden</u> of bad judging. He alone is the righteous judge. John 7:24; 1 Corinthians 4:5; Hebrews 10:30; James 4:12; Revelation 20:13
